Our farm outreach programme is back on track. Every week a team goes out to 4 farm schools to deliver a developmental programme. We are also able to bring some in to our centre to take part in all the programmes we have to offer. This ranges from computer classes to craft classes and also bike riding in our lovely neigbourhood.

Our adult skills development programme has taken a leap forward. We now have 35 adults, mainly female, attending the morning classes 4 times a week. Our aim is to strengthen the knowledge and craftsmanship of the group by having the following workshops: Computer Literacy Textile design Carpentry

Net Vir Pret is planning to start new workshops in Basket Weaving and String Art. Not only will this empower the community with creative skills but can also serve as a means of income as these baskets and string artifact will be sold at the monthly markets in the Overberg district. In past few weeks we have been planning and structuring these workshops and will soon be ready to launch them. With experienced tutors we'll soon be producing beautiful work.

Basket Weaving - Making baskets requires a certain type of cane and well a developed weaving technique. The tutor, who has years of experience with weaving, will make sure the baskets are market ready.

String Art - Earlier this year, three of our youngsters created wonderful objects using String Art - a technique which uses nails and string on a frame to create beautiful objects. The three made such an impact We had three participants who created wonderful string arts. The three made such an impact that they were invited to the KKNK Festival in Outshoorn to display their work. We aim to build on that.
