What a place to visit. After COVID, our reach to Lemoenshoek had stopped and this year we started visiting them again. During the holiday you could see the excitement in the eyes of the kiddies and the adults who were always ready to assist where necessary. We want to make sure that the youngsters there get the same opportunities as those in town. And we did it.



Since the start of the Skills Development Training, it has been important to develop products that we could sell on the Saturday Markets and so we did. As part of empowering the creators we decided on this occasion to give 100% of the income via sales to the persons who created the products. So we took the cushion covers from our Textile group, our bread trays from the carpentry and the newly added Baskets that are being woven by Johan Majola and 4 CWP members. Due to the cold winter mornings and cold days, the market was poorly attended but we are aiming to have a presence again the next time. Next time when we will be even more prepared. An observation made by our quality control partner Michelle Berry, advised us to get a card machine. She noticed that Tourists sometimes don't have cash on them and thus are demotivated to buy some of the products. They simply do not have the time and energy to go to an ATM to draw money. So to avoid this we acquired a machine to better our chances of selling products. In July it arrived and is fully set up for the next market day. So please if you are in the area, pop in to Karoo Daisy and see if there is anything you like.



### Herman For Training

It has always been a dream for Peter Takelo, the Director of Net Vir Pret, to see one of our members go for training in puppetry building. This July, Herman went to Cape Town for a month to work closely with Ukwanda Puppetry Collective. Here he learned new methods of building and how to make the puppets more sustainable. He was asked to assist in the building of the herd of puppet animals that will travel from Morocco across the Mediterranean then all the way across Europe to Norway. It was a wonderful experience and we can't wait to see him in action as he starts with the puppets for this year's production.
